Presbyterians Sharing supports Mike Birks, a Young Adult Intern working in Nicaragua with The Council of Protestant Churches in Nicaragua (CEPAD). CEPAD serves poor communities by promoting justice and peace and helping communities improve their quality of life. Mike is working with one of CEPAD's new agricultural projects in Jinotega. He is helping to set up a small company to sell certified, good-quality, indigenous bean seeds to local farmers. Mike is helping create a marketing plan for the seeds, under the company name Demitierra Frijoles CEPAD. He is also responsible for tracking the results of this project to determine whether or not it will be a viable option to continue, and possibly expand, in the future.
