Easter at Saint David's

The last guest is going out the door as I sit down after a morning at David's Place. It's been a normal morning, maybe a few less guests (it snowed again!).

But the mornings at David's Place are far from 'normal'. Some weeks the conversation seems to have a theme... a couple of weeks ago it was housing with a number of folks worried where they would live. Another morning the theme seemed to be health. Almost everyone I talked with was fighting some bug. Yet another morning the theme was drugs, both the legal and the not-so-legal kind. Mental health makes the list on a regular basis.

Today was different. There was a theme running through the conversations all right but the theme seemed to be new life... new life and hope and expectation for the future. I know it's supposed to be spring and all that but what I heard was more like a series of Easter vignettes and every story made me think more deeply about the church's primary message.

We are here to offer hope and with hope there is no 'one size fits all' response.

Looking at 2 Corinthians 5:14, Paul says Christ died for all, indicating that every human has value, whether black, white, rich or poor, homeless or living in luxury. Underlying the Easter message is the value of every human life on this planet. In an age when 70,000 die in Syria and there are tens of thousands suffering throughout the Middle East and around the world, it is a message that everyone needs to hear. The Easter message is a radical declaration of how God sees every person and, yes, we experience this personally in terms of our own faith. It also underpins our worldview in the context of mission and life.

The day is over at David's Place but we will continue to meet our guests on Gottingen and share a word on Spring Garden and offer hope on Hollis – on any of the streets where we meet another in need of the Easter message of hope.

It really is about light in darkness and life in death and hope in despair. It is why we are here. Offer hope to the hopeless and help to the helpless this Easter and beyond. Then (and maybe only then) can they hear you when you cry out: Christ is Risen! Christ is risen indeed!

A blessed Easter to one and all!
