Cariboo Ministry: A space for kids Our gifts to *Presbyterians Sharing* introduce the love of Christ to children in Ndazkoh, British Colombia. As part of their outreach to people living in and around Ndazkoh, The Reverends Jon Wyminga and Shannon Bell Wyminga run a Kids Space program in the Ndazkoh school. Through songs, activities and discussions, the children – 90% of whom come from the Ndazkoh reserve – learn about the love of God. This program not only ministers to the children, but is a witness of Christ's love for parents and the whole community who see the love and care John and Shannon share with their children. This is an important ministry for a community still struggling with the consequences of the residential schools.
