Food Drive: Hunger Awareness Day across Canada is May 31st. Please join the Mission and Outreach committee in participating in a food drive to benefit Feed NS, an important partner of David's Place and the Out of the Cold Shelter. On

Sunday May 22nd and Sunday May 31st we invite everyone to bring grocery items or a financial contribution for Feed NS. The items most in need are canned vegetables, fruit, meat and fish; flour and sugar, pasta, peanut butter, canned or powdered milk, soups and stews, breakfast cereal. Feed NS is also able to accept fresh produce, fresh or frozen vegetables and meats. Look for our bins as you come in to church and in the church hall near the Mission and Outreach posters.

Myth: Poverty isn't a big problem in Nova Scotia.

Fact: Over 40,000 Nova Scotians rely on food assistance in an average month, indicating they lack the financial resources to meet their basic daily needs. At least 75,000 Nova Scotians are living below the Low Income Cut Off, and one in 10 Canadians are in the same situation. Poverty is a huge problem in our province and across the country.
