MISSION CAPSULES: CANADA: Building relationships Our gifts to *Presbyterians Sharing* support Saskatoon Native Circle Ministry (SNCM) in inner-city Saskatoon. Besides food, warmth, safety and a weekly worship service, the ministry now offers a tutoring program that allows people from the street to work towards the completion of grade twelve. When the ministry moved to its current location in 2008, some people criticized it for being a faith-based organization. SNCM Director, the Rev. Stewart Folster writes, "Now, (these same people) attend our worship service occasionally, and express how they appreciate everything we have to offer."
