We welcome The Rev. Dr. Brian Fraser who is in Halifax to teach a summer course at the Atlantic School of Theology on 'Thinking in Jazz about Missional Leadership.' Brian served as Dean of St. Andrew's Hall, and professor of church history at Vancouver School of Theology. While there, he founded the Elders' Institute. In 2002, he launched Jazzthink, a company that uses the wit, workings, and wisdom of jazz to provoke SMARTer conversations among teams of all kinds. Brian will be doing a public Jazzthink session on Wednesday, July 10, 6:30 pm, at Bearly's House of Blues and Ribs (1269 Barrington St).

Hebrews 10:23 Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. 24 And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, 25 not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

John 14:15-31 "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you. "I will not leave you orphaned; I am coming to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me; because I live, you also will live. On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you. They who have my commandments and keep them are those who love me; and those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them." Judas (not Iscariot) said to him, "Lord, how is it that you will reveal yourself to us, and not to the world?" Jesus answered him, "Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; and the word that you hear is not mine, but is from the Father who sent me. "I have said these things to you while I am still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. You heard me say to you, "I am going away, and I am coming to you.' If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, because the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it occurs, so that when it does occur, you may believe. I will no longer talk much with you, for the ruler of this world is coming. He has no power over me; but I do as the Father has commanded me, so that the world may know that I love the Father. Rise, let us be on our way.

Children In the busy markets of Nicaragua's capital city, Managua, countless children are exposed to violence, abuse and exploitation. PWS&D is working with local partner the Institute for Human Promotion to help create a safe environment for at-risk children and youth to grow and develop. Children and parents are trained to identify and prevent negative situations that can lead to abuse. The program also offers children a chance to play, do homework and form positive personal relationships. Leadership opportunities help troubled youth develop self-confidence and the knowledge to assist others. Carlos, a youth leader, says, "The pain has been lifted away and I have made new friends. I feel capable and I'm willing to take the risk to reduce violence and child labour."
