In Guatemala, the indigenous Maya-Mam people have a rich culture but experience poverty and oppression. PWS&D is working with local partner Maya-Mam Association for Research and Development to improve the livelihoods of Maya Mam people, while also strengthening their cultural identity. With training in agro-ecological production, farmers are using traditional knowledge and locally available resources to grow more food, diversify their diets, and protect the environment. In addition, men and women are being taught how to exercise their collective rights in order to protect their land from mining operations. "I am very grateful," says Teresa Diaz. "I hope that AMMID continues this work so we can improve our living conditions for our sons and daughters."
