GATHERING IN GOD'S PRESENCE

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. We give thanks to God always.

Call to Worship: you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once we were not a people, but now we are God's people; once we had not received mercy, but now we have received mercy. (1 Peter 2:9-10 adapted)

Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with **songs of praise!** For the Lord is a great God, and a great King above all gods. In his hand are the depths of the earth; the heights of the mountains are his also. The sea is his, for he made it, and the dry land, which his hands have **formed.** *O* come, let us worship and bow down, let us kneel before the Lord, our Maker! For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand. O that today you would listen to his voice!

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THE WORD - Readings

Exodus 19: 3-8 3 Then Moses went up to God; the Lord called to him from the mountain, saying, "Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the Israelites: 4 You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on

eagles' wings and brought you to myself. **5** Now therefore, if you obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession out of all the peoples. Indeed, the whole earth is mine, **6** but you shall be for me a priestly kingdom and a holy nation. These are the words that you shall speak to the Israelites." **7** So Moses came, summoned the elders of the people, and set before them all these words that the Lord had commanded him. **8** The people all answered as one: "Everything that the Lord has spoken we will do." Moses reported the words of the people to the Lord.

Matthew 12: 46-50 **46** While he was still speaking to the crowds, his mother and his brothers were standing outside, wanting to speak to him. **47** Someone told him, "Look, your mother and your brothers are standing outside, wanting to speak to you." **48** But to the one who had told him this, Jesus replied, "Who is my mother, and who are my brothers?" **49** And pointing to his disciples, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! **50** For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother."
