WHAT'S HAPPENING BACK HOME???

Update for St. David's: Our construction project is well underway. In the sanctuary, the new rooms have been framed in with electrical wiring run in, and drywall to start soon. In the next few days demolition of the basement stair will start. The new access door in the area where the minster's parking spot is located, will also start soon. Soon after that the driveway on the north side will be partially torn up as we get new plumbing and electrical service trenches. Therefore please do not count on parking on site for the next month to six weeks. We are on track to be back in the church for Sunday services starting Sunday September 7.

As for the new development project, we are still on track with that, and expect that the hall and Sunday School wing will be vacated December 31, with demolition to follow.
