<u>Jeremiah 31:31-34</u>

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt - a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them,

and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. MISSION CAPSULES: New Beginnings for Refugees

Presbyterian World Service & Development's refugee ministry is a response to Christ's call to serve and defend the vulnerable and persecuted. This year, Grace Presbyterian Church in Calgary, Alberta, responded to this call, welcoming a refugee family from Eritrea into their congregation. "It's been a new experience leading a refugee sponsorship and I wouldn't trade it for the world. [The day the family arrived] was the one of the most memorable days of my entire ministry—and I am marking the 24th anniversary of my ordination," says Rev. Leslie Walker. "I am so proud of the PCC for continuing to sponsor refugees, even in these challenging times." In 2013, Presbyterians were able to help resettle 28 refugees arriving to build new lives in Canada.
