REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP: With the approval of Session, Saint David's has joined with Fort Massey United and St. Matthew's United to sponsor a refugee family. Together we will provide the financing and necessities of life for the family. Through a local family and their contacts we have a specific family in mind to sponsor. We will walk with this family in welcoming and integrating them into Canadian life. Two major steps are under way already. First a small volunteer group are launching our fund raising. The three churches will need to raise \$30,000.00 to support our family for a year. Secondly another volunteer group is meeting this week to begin writing the application. We would like to invite everyone to support our fund-raising campaign. In order to begin the fundraising at each of the three participating churches the Fundraising Committee proposes three possibilities: (1) mark your special contribution to your church "for refugees;" (2) consider making a contribution to the refugee fund in lieu of Christmas gifts, either from you or to you; (3) Sign a pledge card available during the coffee hour for a monthly amount for one year. Information and gift cards will be available during coffee hour during Advent at all three churches. As well, the offering at the Choir's Carol Service on December 20th and the loose offering from the 4 pm Christmas Eve service will go towards this important "Open Doors" initiative.
