Gathering: As Sarah waited...Ninety years for a son to fulfil God's promise. We wait in hope for what we thought had been spoken to us. As Moses waited...40 years in the desert, being prepared by God to lead his people. We wait for emptiness and humility; for bravado to wither. As Israel waited...40 years of wandering, hungry, depressed, thirsting, unsure. We wait for the right time to act. As the Prophets waited...1000 years of promises that God would raise up a Saviour. We wait for the signs that God has not forgotten. As Mary waited...9 months of her 14 years for the child of God. We feel the **birth-pains, yet fear for the child.** As John the Baptist waited...Scanning the crowds for the one whose sandals he would not be worthy to untie. We long for an experience of the Divine. As

Jesus waited... 30 years of creeping time. 40 days in the desert of temptation. 3 years of misunderstanding. 3 days in the depths of hell. So we wait for God's time. Preparing the way. Our turn to toil on levelling mountains and straightening paths. Our turn to watch the horizon. Our turn to pass on the hope that He who promised is faithful and will come back.

24 Prayer: I wait. I wait for you to answer. I wait for the first light of dawn. I wait for you. I wait for you. I wait for you. I wait. My waiting is my prayer. In the pain of the waiting I feel my longing for you. I long for you to be here. I wait for your arrival, you who has always been here. In the waiting I know a larger space in my soul is being excavated. I can feel the growing emptiness. But I know that it will be filled with your gracious, loving presence. Make me ready to receive you. I wait.

Hymn: I waited for the Lord my God (1-2) 23

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A moment to Meditate: Be silent **Be still** Alone **Empty** Before your God Say nothing Ask nothing Be silent Be still Let your God look upon you That is all God knows **God understands** God loves you with an enormous love God only wants to look upon you with divine love.

Confession: God of Grace, you call us to be different from the world, but the world is seductive, and so we come here to be strengthened. God of Vision, you hold before us an alternate way of life, different priorities, different loyalties, different values. But we know that the world is not only seductive but powerful, and so we are drawn in to following its priorities, accepting its values, showing loyalty to its gods. God who blesses the meek, the peacemakers, the merciful, forgive us when we lose sight of these qualities, when we misunderstand their role in the world.

Hymn: I waited for the Lord my God (3-4)

Matthew 24:36-44 "But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and

drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour

"Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" (Luke 7:20)

Hymn: Those who wait on the Lord

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Henry Nouwen shows us the way to a life of active waiting with a sense of promise that is based on hope and trust in God. Henri teaches us what it means to actively wait, encourages us to wait in community, and shows us that in our waiting we must be willing "to be handed over" as Jesus was. And we learn that just as we are waiting on God to define our lives, God is waiting on us to choose to follow him. "God became human not only to act among us but also to be the recipient of our responses." (p 110, The Path of Waiting)

1. Henri writes, "A waiting person is someone who is present to the moment, believing that this moment is *the* moment... Patient living means to live actively in the present and wait there. "(p 97)
