A MESSAGE FOR EVERYONE



Gathering: God shows no partiality. No race or group is shown special advantage. In every nation anyone who respects him and who does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message God sent to all through the people of Israel. It is a message of peace by Jesus Christ, who has been made Lord of all. God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.

Hymn: In Christ there is no east or west (1-2)

Confessional Prayers: Almighty God, you love us, but we have not loved you. You call, but we have not listened. We walk away from neighbors in need, wrapped in our own concerns. We condone evil, prejudice, warfare, and greed. Gracious God, our sins are too heavy to carry, too real to hide, and too deep to undo. Forgive what our lips tremble to name, what our hearts can no longer bear, and what has become for us a consuming fire of judgment. Set us free from a past that we cannot change; open to us a future in which we can be changed; and grant us grace to grow more and more in your likeness and image, through Jesus Christ, the light of the world. Amen.

Words of Assurance: In God's mercy, we are made whole again, baptized with the Spirit, forgiven and renewed, able to show God's glory shining in the face of Jesus Christ. Amen.

Hymn: In Christ there is no east or west (3-4)

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Acts 10:34-43 Then Peter began to speak to them "*I truly* understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ-he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

Hymn: Brother, sister, let me serve you (1-2)

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Peter's speech is monumental. It reflects Peter's gigantic "aha!" moment when he has come to realize that, within God's missional program of salvation, all really, truly means all... What is absolutely new here are the implications of divine impartiality. The character of God as an impartial God now means the character of God's community is impartial. For Peter this is a conversion experience second to none. "What Peter did changed the course of Christianity forever. He opened it to the whole world - to you and me, who would never have been welcome if this vision of God's impartiality had not worked its way through Peter's - and Cornelius' - active imaginations. When Peter declared, "God shows no partiality," he opened the possibility that anyone – everyone - is welcome in the family of faith. He also put us on warning: the rules were changed for you, so that you could come in - who are you, then, to prevent God from blessing the whole human family? Who are you to stand in the way of God's love?" Rev. David Lewicki This story is a powerful symbol of a promise enunciated from the beginning of Luke's gospel and throughout Acts, a promise represented most powerfully in the resurrection of Jesus. Without question, God's spirit is moving. The only question is whether Peter, as well as the church, will sense the winds of change and follow God's lead.
