# Matthew 21: 1-11 Jesus' Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, "The Lord needs them." And he will send them immediately.' This took place to fulfil what had been spoken through the prophet, saying,

'Tell the daughter of Zion,

Look, your king is coming to you,

humble, and mounted on a donkey,

and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.'

The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting,

'Hosanna to the Son of David!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!

Hosanna in the highest heaven!'

When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, 'Who is this?' The crowds were saying, 'This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee.'

# Summary of the Passion from Matthew 26:14-27:66

Then one of the twelve, who was called Judas Iscariot, went to the chief priests and said, "What will you give me if I betray him to you?" They paid him thirty pieces of silver. And from that moment he began to look for an opportunity to betray him.... (that day) they prepared the Passover meal. When it was evening, he took his place with the twelve; and while they were eating, he said, "Truly I tell you, one of you will betray me." And they became greatly distressed and began to say to him one after another, "Surely not I, Lord?"... While they were eating, Jesus took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he

broke it, gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is my body." Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you; for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. When they had sung the hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. To Peter he said: "Truly I tell you, this very night, before the cock crows, you will deny me three times." ...In the garden he said: Then he said to them, "I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and stay awake with me."... See, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners....While he was still speaking, Judas, one of the twelve, arrived; ... "Friend, do what you are here to do." Then they came and laid hands on Jesus and arrested him.

The high Priest asked him: "What is it that they testify against you?" But Jesus was silent. Then the high priest said to him, "I put you under oath before the living God, tell us if you are the Messiah, the Son of God." What is your verdict?" They answered, "He deserves death."... Then they spat in his face and struck him; and some slapped him, They bound him, led him away, and handed him over to Pilate the governor. Now Jesus stood before the governor; and the governor asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus said, "You say so.".. after flogging Jesus, he handed him over to be crucified. They spat on him, and took the reed and struck him on the head. After mocking him, they stripped him of the robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him away to crucify him.

**Philippians 2: 5-8** Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God,

did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave,

being born in human likeness.

And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death even death on a cross.
