**MISSION MOMENTS:** A journey toward reconciliation In June, 33 Presbyterians from across Canada visited three of the PCC's seven Indigenous ministries, worshipped at Mistawasis church and visited the sites where two residential schools were run by the PCC. The group listened

to stories of anger and pain and offered apologies. They also witnessed some of the ways in which PCC ministries are transforming lives. At Birdtail Sioux First Nation, site of the Birtle residential school, Doug Hanska thanked the visitors with an honour song. He explains, "The stop they did in Birdtail, I know it may not mean much to a lot of people, but to some of us it means a lot," he said. "We can forgive and move on, like our teachings tell us."

#### Revelation 3:14-22 The Message to Laodicea

'And to the angel of the church in Laodicea write: The words of the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the origin of God's creation: 'I know your works; you are neither cold nor hot. I wish that you were either cold or hot. So, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I am about to spit you out of my mouth. For you say, "I am rich, I have prospered, and I need nothing." You do not realize that you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked. Therefore I counsel you to buy from me gold refined by fire so that you may be rich; and white

robes to clothe you and to keep the shame of your nakedness from being seen; and salve to anoint your eyes so that you may see. I reprove and discipline those whom I love. Be earnest, therefore, and repent. Listen! I am standing at the door, knocking; if you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in to you and eat with you, and you with me. To the one who conquers I will give a place with me on my throne, just as I myself conquered and sat down with my Father on his throne. Let anyone who has an ear listen to what the Spirit is saying to the churches.' Matthew 3:13-17 Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness." Then he consented. And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased."

## The Synod

The Synod is the second highest court in our Presbyterian Church in Canada court system. It is comprised of all ministers, members of the Order of Diaconal Ministries and representative elders on the roll of the presbyteries within its area. It oversees the Presbyteries, ensuring that business is conducted properly, and providing support and advice as needed. We belong to the Synod of the Atlantic Provinces, which consists of the Presbyteries of New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland, Halifax-Lunenburg, Pictou and Cape Breton.

Our Synod owns and operates Camp Geddie, located near Merigomish, NS. This provides wonderful opportunities for our children and young people to come to know Christ in a safe and caring place. It is also used as a facility for events and retreats during the off-camping season. The Synod employs a full-time Camping and Youth Consultant, Mrs. Whitney Canning, who organizes events for our young people and also serves as the Executive Director at Camp Geddie. The Synod also provides a Synod Hospital Visitor, Mr. Lindsay Rankin, who serves a chaplaincy function in the Halifax hospitals on a part-time basis, pastoring and caring for those who come to Halifax for care and treatment from throughout the Synod, and for their families as well.

The Synod also encourages, facilitates, helps arrange funding and organizes educational events and mission programs and initiatives throughout the presbyteries of the Atlantic region, with workshops designed to assist congregations, particularly those in transition in these changing times.

The Synod of the Atlantic Provinces meets regularly once a year, beginning at 7:00 p.m. on the third Monday of October. Its business is usually complete by noon on the Wednesday of that week. This year the congregation of Calvin Presbyterian Church, Halifax NS will be hosting our Synod's meeting from Monday, October 16<sup>th</sup>, 2017 through to Wednesday, Oct. 18<sup>th</sup>.
