MISSION MOMENTS - Serving vulnerable people in Romania

Life is difficult in Romania. The monthly salary of a school teacher is the equivalent of about \$250 USD, so many people feel forced to leave in search of work in other EU countries. This economic migration is creating new challenges for the Romanian society. There are over 300,000 migration orphans and a growing number of elderly people who are left behind. The good news is that they are not left alone. Since 2011, Diakonia Christian Foundation for Social Work of the Reformed Church in Romania has been reaching out to Roma children, people living with disabilities, and the elderly. In 2017, the foundation's social workers and volunteers made over 8,200 visits to the elderly, providing services such as helping with personal hygiene, cleaning and providing medical care or devices. Your gifts to *Presbyterians Sharing* are helping to accompany and care for vulnerable people in Romania.

Out of the Cold - Saint David's congregation is again preparing lunches for the Out of the Cold Shelter at Saint Matthew's Church. Out of the Cold is a community-based, volunteer-run organization that provides shelter and community supports to people who are homeless and precariously housed. We provide 20 lunches guests can take away in the morning, consisting of a meat or cheese sandwich, fruit, a drink, and a cookie or granola bar. Volunteers deliver the lunches to Saint Matthews Church on Saturday morning before 8:30 a.m. or Saturday evening after 8 p.m. If you would like to take part in this work, contact Gary Smith at 902-832-8923.

Special Congregational Meeting - Session is calling a special congregational meeting on **Sunday, February 3** after church (snow date Feb. 10). The purpose is to consider an application to the Presbyterian Church Building Corporation for a loan to assist with funds required to build stairs, shore up the bank, procure a sign, and address the exterior walls. The PCBC is designed to lend funds to churches under favourable terms to support work on buildings and property.

New Beginnings Update:

The New Beginnings small group leaders have been busy since October working on the next phase of the process. We want to consult with groups, agencies, business associations and other services in our neighbourhood to listen and learn where the needs and gaps are and how Saint David's can best be a caring, responsive, effective presence in downtown Halifax. With assistance from the Mission Fund of the Synod of the Atlantic Provinces, we have engaged a facilitator, Robert Nichols from a local consulting group (Common Good Solutions) with experience in assisting community organizations including churches such as St. Andrew's United. He will help us formulate the questions for dialogue with the community and facilitate the community meeting planned for February 12, 2019. The group leaders are compiling the invitation list and making the contacts. We pray the result of this process will be a clearer picture of how we are being led by God to re-vision our ministry and future mission in our community.

Isaiah 62:1-5

For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not rest, until her vindication shines out like the dawn, and her salvation like a burning torch. ²The nations shall see your vindication, and all the kings your glory; and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the LORD will give. ³You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the LORD, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God. ⁴You shall no more be termed Forsaken, and your land shall no more be termed Desolate; but you shall be called My Delight Is in Her, and your land Married; for the LORD delights in you, and your land shall be married. ⁵ For as a young man marries a young woman, so shall your builder marry you, and as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride, so shall your God rejoice over you.

I Corinthians 12:1-11

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. ² You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. ³ Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. ⁴ Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵ and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; ⁶ and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. ⁷ To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. ⁸ To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, ⁹ to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, ¹⁰ to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. ¹¹ All these are activated by one and

the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

John 2:1-11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. ² Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. 3When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." ⁴ And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." ⁵ His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." ⁶ Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. 7 Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. 8 He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. 9 When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom ¹⁰ and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." 11 Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.
