Did you know that each week we supplement what we receive from Feed NS with 12 loaves of bread? We also go through 2 dozen hard boiled eggs, tea biscuits and cheese if we have it, each week that our early arrivals enjoy before the main meal. The bread, eggs, and tea biscuits are all provided by our volunteers.

**Our Givings to Mission** - On Friday January 3rd, a cheque was sent by express mail from Saint David's to The Presbyterian Church in Canada offices at 50 Wynford Drive in Toronto. This cheque brought our 2019 total for **Presbyterians Sharing to \$16,923** (84.6% of our target) and our 2019 total for **Presbyterian World Service & Development to \$7,584**. Thank you all for your generosity.
