PWS&D Responds to Malawi Floods

Recent heavy rains caused flooding to parts of southern Malawi. The deluge has damaged infrastructure and affected electricity and water supplies. Water sources have been contaminated and water-borne diseases, as well as cholera and malaria outbreaks, are posing serious health risks. Dozens of people have died and hundreds of thousands have been impacted. The number of people continues to rise as more information becomes available.

PWS&D is in close contact with partners in the affected area who are monitoring the situation and coordinating a response to meet the most immediate needs like food, emergency non-food items, shelter, and water and sanitation services. Please continue to keep the people and communities in southern Malawi in your prayers. As needs are being assessed, PWS&D is accepting donations to help bring relief to those suffering in the wake of flooding. Please mark donations as "Malawi floods."

Rainbow Communion is the special LGBTQI Listening Committee of The Presbyterian Church in Canada.
